### *Course description*

The Certificate IV in Disability is designed for individuals working in the disability sector, as well as those interested in gaining work in this particular field.

The course addresses work in residential group homes, training resource centres, day respite centres and open employment services, other community settings and clients' homes.

These workers:

- Apply knowledge and skills gained through qualifications and/or previous experience to provide training and support to people with disabilities to enhance their ability to achieve greater levels of independence, self reliance and community participation
- Report to service managers and may liaise with health professionals and other service agencies
- May work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a limited number of lower classified workers.



### *Benefits of disability work*

The goal of a disability worker is to enhance the lives of disabled individuals by teaching them how to become more self-sufficient and engaged in the community. Disability workers make a significant difference to the lives of the people they work with, hence, making this profession truly rewarding!
